WHEN SHOULD I TAKE MY PUPPY FOR WALKS?

Exercise and mental stimulation walks: two to three times per day

Potty training walks: start with once every 30-60 minutes

General rule of thumb: A puppy "hold time" is their age in months translated to hours—so if your puppy is 3 months of age, they can hold it for 3 hours maximum.

Puppy's First Vet Visit Checklist

- Filled-out forms provided by your vet
- All veterinary records you received from the shelter/rescue/breeder
- List of important questions or concerns you may have
- Notes on amount and brand of food and treats you offer at home
- Any medications you were given by the shelter/rescue/breeder
- Leash and collar/harness
- Chew toy for distraction
- Small treats to reward good behavior
- A stool sample, as fresh as possible
- Dog carrier or crate lined with a towel or shirt that smells like home
