Kitten-Proofing Your Home Checklist

Kitten-proofing creates a secure environment for your curious little ball of fluff. Here's a checklist for kitten-proofing your home:

Hide electrical cords

They should be covered with cord covers or hidden away.



Hide valuables and breakables Don't place breakables anywhere they could easily be knocked or pushed over.

Get rid of toxic house plants

Check all your plants against the ASPCA's Toxic Plant List to confirm they won't make your cat sick if they nibble on them.

Secure furniture

Make sure furniture isn't going to be knocked over if your kitten jumps or climbs on it.

Add baby locks

Consider adding baby locks on cabinets, especially those that contain cleaning chemicals.

Close toilet lids

Curious kittens can slip and fall in and potentially drown.

Put human food away

Some human food can be toxic or, at the very least, give them a tummy ache.

Check all screens and doors Ensure they're secure and don't have holes your cat could squeeze through.



Block access to any appliances This includes blenders, water heaters, and furnaces.
