



Kitten-Proofing Your Home Checklist

Kitten-proofing creates a secure environment for your curious little ball of fluff. Here's a checklist for kitten-proofing your home:



- Hide electrical cords**
They should be covered with cord covers or hidden away.
- Hide valuables and breakables**
Don't place breakables anywhere they could easily be knocked or pushed over.
- Get rid of toxic house plants**
Check all your plants against the ASPCA's Toxic Plant List to confirm they won't make your cat sick if they nibble on them.
- Secure furniture**
Make sure furniture isn't going to be knocked over if your kitten jumps or climbs on it.
- Add baby locks**
Consider adding baby locks on cabinets, especially those that contain cleaning chemicals.
- Close toilet lids**
Curious kittens can slip and fall in and potentially drown.
- Put human food away**
Some human food can be toxic or, at the very least, give them a tummy ache.
- Check all screens and doors**
Ensure they're secure and don't have holes your cat could squeeze through.
- Block access to any appliances**
This includes blenders, water heaters, and furnaces.
